Half Term & Training Day



What's happening in School!

- Nursery children have enjoyed changing the story of the bear hunt this week. They are changing the places the hunt takes place, making the characters walk through jelly and slime. The nursery children have been laughing and enjoying retelling this story out loud.
- Reception have been thinking about special buildings in the Chuckery area such as the Mosque and the Church. Children have been drawing maps of their own to show these buildings and other places that they know in Chuckery.
- Year 1 have used their knowledge of animals and habitats to explore and compare the habitats found in Chuckery with a safari in Kenya. They also finished writing their animal explorers journal to encourage others to explore their local habitats.
- Year 2, this week in writing have been finishing our letters to our crayons who quit. Hopefully, they allow us to use them again now they have our persuasive letters. We have also improved our art skills and used the new skills we have learnt to create our own piece. This will also hopefully show the crayons how sorry we are.

In maths, we have started to look at money, the value that coins have and learning different combinations to make an amount. Over the holidays, please allow your children to explore this further, as we will continue after half-term. Please also continue to read daily and practise your child's spelling with them.

- Next term year 3 will be faced with the difficult task of finding out "The true story of the three little pigs" Children will develop their mapping skills as part of this mini adventure
- Year 4 have learnt about reversible and irreversible changes in science. After half term we are starting a new mini adventure about the plague.
- Year 5 will be starting our new miniadventure after half term and we are looking forward to dressing up for world book day!
- Year 6 have been learning about Humanism. We have looked at the

values of a Humanist and studied a few famous people, who are Humanists.

EASTER 2022 Walsall Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF)

Walsall Council We are running a programme for children ages 5 – 16 years who are entitled to benefit-related free schools meals over the Easter Holiday. This programme is aiming to provide healthy food and enriching activities during the holidays to children. When do the Easter activities start?

The activities will take place over the Easter holidays and will be available on:

- Week 1 Monday 11th April to Thursday 14 April 2022
- Week 2 Tuesday 19 Friday 22 April

What will be on offer?

There are a wide range of opportunities for children and young people to engage in the Easter offer, with the option to choose from the following;

- One week of holiday club providing a range of activities throughout the day for children to engage for at least four hours for four days for one week per child with a healthy meal included.
- Or four pick and mix sessions offer targeted at young people to provide them with a choice of activities they can engage with, this will also provide opportunities to provide children with specific skills. These could be courses in, for example, dance, music, swimming, sports coaching, youth work training, fishing, mentoring

How do families register?

Each eligible child will receive a letter in the post with their unique code (separate code for each child) -

- A letter will be sent out to eligible children on the 7th March 2022 with their unique code.
- To book and register activities families can either do this online.

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Covid 19 Symptoms

If your child has any of these 3 symptoms:

- A high temperature: any new high temperature where your child feels hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature).
- 2. A new continuous cough: coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours.
- A loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste: a noticeable loss of smell or taste or things smell and taste different to normal.

You should:

- Book a PCR test for them
- Inform school
- Keep them at home, away from other people, for 10 days or until you receive a negative PCR test result for them

In addition, Walsall Public Health are asking that anyone with the following symptoms takes a PCR test as a precaution –

- Shortness of breath or unexplained fatigue
- Diarrhoea, nausea and vomiting
- Headache that lasts a long time
- Myalgia (muscle aches or full body pains)
- Sore throat
- Blocked or runny nose

In these cases they do not need to isolate and can still come to school while you wait for the PCR test as long as they are well enough. However, if the test is positive you should:

- Inform school
- Follow the testing guidance below

You can register for a PCR test at a local testing centre online

at www.nhs.uk/coronavirus and tick the box that says your local authority asked you to take a test. Or you can call 119 and say the same thing to book a test. You can also choose to have PCR test delivered to your home.



If you test positive for Covid-19 stay at home and self-isolate do not go to work, school, or public areas and do not use public transport or taxis. From 16th August 2021, if you are fully vaccinated or aged under 18 years and 6

months, you will not be required to self-isolate if you live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 unless you have symptoms.

Non-Covid Illnesses

Children will still get colds and other seasonal illnesses that have nothing to do with Covid-19. We ask that parents make sensible decisions about sending their children to school, keeping them at home when they are ill but ensuring they are in school whenever they can be. Please note, where attendance falls below 93% the Education Welfare Officer will become involved whether we have had reasons or not.
