Next Week in School

Each week we share with you some of the fantastic things that the children will be doing across the School:

- Year 6 will be writing their own narrative version of The Highwayman and we will be continuing our work with fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Year 5 will be inventing their own version of the BFG's frobscottle and we look forward to reading about their potions exciting after effects. In maths we will be looking at finding fractions of quantities. Year 4 will be moving on to addition and subtraction. They will also be writing

- stories about Howard Carter's discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb.
- Year 3 are going to be calculating with money next week. We are also going to be writing our own stories that we have planned this week. Year 2 we are writing a persuasive letter to convince "Mrs Armitage" to use our vehicle design.

- Reception will be doing number bonds and simple addition. In literacy we will be learning to ask questions and on Friday we will use these questions to ask the firefighters of what they do and how they help people. We are also thinking about how to stay safe and use objects and equipment safety.
- Nursery will be turning the clothes shop in the classroom into a sweets shop so that they can role play their experience this week.
