War

When war or conflict is in the news, it can cause feelings such as fear, sadness and anxiety for children, young people and adults. As teachers, parents and carers, it is impossible to protect children from frightening and confusing world events, such as war and conflict. We can, however:

- Create a sense of safety at home and school
- Find ways to cope together with uncertainty
- Be hopeful for peace and safety for all
- Be compassionate
- Look after our own wellbeing and seek support as we support others

Here are some things you may find helpful:

- Try to find out what your children already know about the situation, and how they found out about it. Reinforce the importance of getting their news from a reputable source, such as the BBC. You could look at reliable news sources together.
- Reassure your child that parents and carers at home, and teachers at school, are there to keep them safe and that many people around the world are working hard to try to resolve the conflict.
- Encourage children to think about the things they can be more certain about and influence, and to look after their own wellbeing. For example, they can still play, learn, be with their friends, listen to music, play sport etc.
- Children's ability to cope is influenced by their parents and carers and other important adults in their lives. It is important that you look after your own mental health and seek support if you feel overwhelmed.

What's happening in School!

Nursery have had a visit from a Midwife this week as part of their topic on jobs. The children were fascinated to listen to our guest talk about what she does at work and how she looks after mummies and babies.

Reception the children have been role playing in the safari area. They have dressed as explorers and talked about the different animals that they can see on their trip.

Year 1 have been making a fruit smoothie as part of our learning on healthy eating. Year 1 chopped, blended and tasted their yummy fruit smoothies.

Year 2 have continued to learn about animals and plants that can be found in different habitats. We have been exploring micro habitats and discussing where they can be found. In Maths we have reading time at 5 minutes intervals and recapping place value.

Year 3 will be busy next week collating a crime scene report - was the wolf innocent?

Year 4 have been learning about medicines they used in the past and compared them to current medicines. We also wrote a letter to the Mayor of London in 1665 on how to deal with the plague epidemic. Next week we will be moving onto our RE topic: The Journey of Life.

Year 5 will be carrying on with their mini-

adventure about respect and writing their story about a refugee. We will also be moving on to some fractions work in maths

Year 6 have been having exciting experiences with an Anglo-Saxon Visitor, who came into school to teach us all about the Anglo-Saxon way of life (including fighting and war times!). We have ben focusing on decimals within maths and next week will look at recounting the story of the Battle of Hastings.
