Living with Covid Update

The Government has announced their COVID-19 response 'Living with COVID-19' strategy. In England, most of the measures that have been in place to control the spread of the virus during the pandemic are no longer required by law. In school we have removed many of the former measures such as year group bubbles and wearing face coverings. We are also resuming assemblies after 2 years!

However, we have asked staff to continue to test twice weekly and ask that both staff and children follow the following advice:

- If you feel unwell and develop symptoms associated with the COVID-19 virus, I would urge you to continue to test them for the virus
- Please continue to stay at home and book a PCR test by calling 119 or book online https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test
- Test sites are open 7 days a week. Order a home test kit if you cannot get to a test site.
 This will help to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with COVID-19.

If you do test positive for the COVID-19 virus, we ask that you continue to self-isolate for at least five days and only return to school after having two negative lateral flow tests on consecutive days. Whilst doing so is no longer the law, it is very sensible practice and helps us minimise the risk of COVID-19 spreading in the school.

What's happening in School!

- Nursery enjoyed dressing up as different job roles and catching the bus to work.
- Reception have been designing their own safari parks and drawing maps of them showing where the different animals and attractions are located.
- Year 1 have been learning about healthy food. We looked at what foods might be in a balanced diet and went on a trip to ASDA, where we bought healthy food for our smoothies and tasted some delicious fruits.
- Year 2 have started a new mini adventure learning about habitats and hibernation. We were very excited to find some mysterious footprints in the classroom and decided to go to Walsall Arboretum Park to find habitats. We decided if the park is a good habitat for a bear. In Maths we have started to learn how to read an analogue clock focusing on o'clock and half past
- Year 3 are exploring mapping skill, four grid references and following compass direction at Cannock Chase.
- Year 4, we will be continuing our work about The Plague. We will also be starting cricket in our P.E lessons.
- Year 5 will be starting a new mini-adventure and they will be carrying on with their multiplication and division in maths.
- Year 6 have launched their new topic Anglo- Saxons. They have been
 investigating artefacts from this era and
 enquiring about the path that Angles,
 Saxons, and Jutes took to invade Britian. In
 Maths we have been looking at 2 and 3
 decimal places and looking to round up to 3
 decimal points

Help for families to talk to children about Ukraine and how to help them avoid misinformation:

Russia's invasion of Ukraine is distressing and concerning, and we understand children may have questions or be seeking reassurance.

Our children are constantly absorbing things they read, see and hear and it's completely natural for them to be picking up on the situation in Ukraine and feeling anxious and also asking questions about what is going on. These tips may help you:

- Give them the basics and don't avoid the conversation Listen to their worries and provide honest answers to their questions about what is going on, don't overcomplicate your responses and try to give details at an age-appropriate level.
- Don't avoid answering their questions about the situation as this could promote more anxiety, but keep to basic facts.
- Ensure they feel supported and safe It's important to help children understand the level of threat to them and their friends and family. Explain this is happening in Ukraine, a different country and show this if necessary using a globe or map.
- Avoid exposure to a constant stream of news – Be mindful of whether you have the radio or TV on all day, as children will be absorbing news without us realising it.
- Watch where they are getting their news –
 We know that fake news is an issue,
 particularly on social media sites so be
 mindful of what children are absorbing and
 where they are getting it. Ensure they
 understand that not everything they see on
 social media sites is true, and they know
 what reliable sources of news they can
 access.

School staff can offer specific advice and support if you feel that your child is becoming overly anxious and distressed.

Providing support and reassurance and diverting their thoughts through engagement in pleasurable activities can help.
