



What we have been learning about this term

In RE, (Respect for all) the children have been discussing and present- the importance of following the golden rule. As well as this, pupils have been discussing their ideas about how best to life in a diverse community.

In another RE topic, (commitment) the children have been exploring the word commitment. We have analysed varied worldviews so that they can explain the meaning of the commitment to humanity.

In geography, (Scott of the Antarctic) the children have been learning how to read a 4 and 6 grid reference map. They have also enjoyed learning about the climate conditions in the South Pole.

In History, (Hatshepsut) the children have been looking at the span of ancient civilisation. They have also understood how civilisation has an impact on us today.
